For the past twenty-five years, our nonprofit has been dedicated to making a positive impact on the lives of homeless dogs in Plumas County and beyond. Our mission is not just about rescuing dogs, but also about ensuring that these incredible animals receive the care, training, and love they need from our facility as they heal past traumas and welcome a brand new chapter in life.

This last year, especially, our rescue has revitalized our dog enrichment and training protocols with the help of our Volunteer Trainer, Hannah Tomatis. Hannah, along with our dedicated staff and volunteers, recognizes that these tools are crucial in helping dogs adapt to new environments and, most importantly, their

future homes. It has been a true joy to watch our dogs progress as we have shifted into this new program, wherein each staff member and volunteer is assigned a dog (or two). This training involves the use of marker words such as "good," expanding their knowledge of commands, and working on specific issues such as jumping or reactivity, all while observing body language to gauge their comfort level. It has been especially beneficial for long-stay dogs like Jezzy and Memphis, who now show more patience and a greater sense of contentment. Both of these dogs recently had positive interactions with other dogs, which is an enormous step in the right direction. Through the efforts and hard work of our staff and volunteers, a few of our long-stay dogs were recently able to find understanding and loving homes.

We are constantly looking for ways to expand and improve our operations, and this Giving Tuesday and holiday season, you can be a part of our efforts. Giving Tuesday was created in 2012 as a simple idea: a day that encourages people to do good and support causes they care for.

High Sierra Animal Rescue owes our success to the unwavering support of our community and dedicated supporters.
