

Calypso and her fight against a Giant Kidney Worm



If you have been keeping up with the local paper, HSAR emails, or our social media posts, then you have probably heard about Calypso! This fun-loving, sweet puppy found her way to us with her three siblings after they were left in the outdoor kennel one night at a county shelter. Just after we took them in we noticed that Calypso had some symptoms that would usually indicate a urinary track infection. We attempted to treat her with normal antibiotics but as she went in for her spay surgery, it became apparent to Dr. Clement at American Valley Animal Hospital, that what Calypso was going through was much more complex than a common infection. Samples were sent off to the lab and showed that she had an extremely rare parasite that tends to reside in one or both kidneys.

This kidney worm had laid thousands of eggs in her intestinal cavity before making its final voyage to her right kidney where it grew to the length of two and a half feet. If left untreated it would have caused her kidney to burst. Dr. Clement had never experienced this before and as we called other vets nearby, we learned that hardly any veterinarians in our region had. We knew that we had to act fast and get her to <u>Sierra Veterinary Specialists</u> in Reno where they would assess her health and remove the worm, the affected kidney, and the eggs. During this time we called upon our supporters to help us with the cost of her surgery and prescription medicine costs. We were overwhelmed and touched by your response and would like to extend a final "thank you" to you for helping us and this sweet puppy.

Calypso bounced back from her life saving surgery within 24 hours and soon after, she met her adoptive mom who absolutely adores her. She now spends her days alongside her momma as they go on walks and run errands together. We are so grateful and proud to reside in Plumas County and serve not only this community, but Lassen and Washoe Counties as well. This is why our nonprofit exists; to ensure that dogs like her receive the second chance and love that they deserve regardless of the cost and time it requires. If we hadn't rescued her it's very likely that she wouldn't be alive today.
